

- He lived from 1862-1918
- Gustav Klimt's home city was the fascinating turn-ofthe-century Vienna of the belle époque.



- He was an academic and founded a group called the Vienna Secession
- His work is highly decorative
- He was a leader in the movement called
 Art Nouveau





- Klimt liked looking at Byzantine lcons
- In nearly every painting he used gold
- Interestingly, his father was a goldsmith

Portrait of Eugenia Primavesi 1913-14.





1917-18. Gustav Klimt – Dame mit Fächer (Lady with a Fan)

This is one of the most famous gold pictures. It is called The Kiss 1907-1908






Studies for the Stoclet Frieze 1905-1909

We used oil pastels and metallic pens when we made our own pictures.




Tree of Life, Stoclet Frieze, 1909


